

## The Ticker Reading Books and Worksheets. Ready. Steady. Go!

- Use when your child is interested.
- Re-visit when needed.
- Use your own ideas to extend learning.
- Reading, handwriting and spelling broadly in line with EYFS curriculum.
- Sounds of letters and blending words taught as they appear in the Ticker books along with the early comprehension, handwriting and spelling skills.
- Initially activities will need adult support and supervison, e.g. in reading, handwriting, cutting, measuring.



Children will already have experienced the Early Years important pre-reading and handwriting activities along with valuable opportunities to enrich their language development across the EYFS seven areas of learning and it is intended that they will continue to do so as they use the Ticker Books. The correct oral sounding of letters and blending of words is emphasized alongside the early comprehension, spelling and handwriting skills. This approach is intended to raise phonological awareness, so that children learn to hear and manipulate sounds within the spoken language. Audio files are useful aides to teach correct pronunciation of sounds.

A range of reading strategies, including the use of Phonics, High Frequency Words, Tricky words and kinaesthetic activities are introduced in the Ticker books along with work sheets which are intended to be used when and where needed.

In the teaching of phonics, magnetic boards and letters are valuable resources as they can be moved around quickly and easily, particularly when teaching spelling and the vowel and consonant words, (VC, CVC CVCC, and CCVC words) such as, cat, lost, clap.

Every child is individual and the time it takes a child to read a book and attempt to use a worksheet varies. Make haste slowly! Stop when interest wanes. Re - visit the books and worksheets as often as necessary. Use your own ideas to reinforce and extend the suggested tasks.

PHONICS – Throughout the Ticker books, the correct sounding of letters and the blending of words are emphasized and taught as they appear alongside the early comprehension, handwriting and spelling skills.

PHONEMES The 26 letters in the English language and many of the 44 unique vowel and consonant speech, known as phonemes, (consisting of 19 vowel sounds and 24 consonant sounds), are introduced. They are put together to make sounds and words. e.g.  $a \ t - at$ ,  $c \ a \ t - cat$ . Two consonants which are sounded together at the beginning or ending of words, known as consonant blends are introduced alongside activities aimed to raise awareness of the short and long vowel sounds a, e, i, o, u. Most vowel diagraphs, such as, name, time, bake, are introduced as sight words. NONSENSE WORDS such as  $g \ e \ g \ - geg$ , (also known by some adults as Alien Words, Ha Ha Words, etc.) are introduced, so that children have to sound and blend to read the word, not merely remember the sentences like reciting a poem. In the teaching of reading and spelling, magnetic boards and letters are valuable resources as they can be moved around quickly and easily, particularly when teaching vowels (V) and single or double consonants words (C). For example, VC -  $a \ t$ , CVC -  $l \ o \ st$  and CCVC -  $cl \ a \ p$ .

GRAPHEMES, - A letter or letters are used to represent a sound (phoneme) in a word. They are made up from 1 letter – h a t – hat;

2 letters – oo - b oo k – book; 3 letters –igh –n igh t,- night; or 4 letters – eigh – eigh t –eight.

HIGH FREQUENCY WORDS which appear most frequently in written material and include TRICKY WORDS are memorized as a whole word by sight. They are known by a variety of names. KS1 curriculum calls them common exception words, but they are also called Irregular words, sight words, look and say words. They are not decodable, have little meaning on their own, e.g. to, so, called, but play an important part in contributing to the meaning of a sentence. The Ticker Books contain most High Frequency Words and Tricky Words found in its' 4 phases i.e. Phase 2 – 6 words, 3 - 12 words, 4 - 14 words and 5 -9 words. Pre- reading activities are regarded as Phase 1. Later when more sounds have been taught, such as consonant and vowel digraphs, some of these High Frequency words can be read phonetically.

KINAESTHETIC Through other EYFS areas of learning, such as Expressive Arts and Design, Physical Development and Understanding the World, children are actively engaged, using their senses to reinforce learning. They use and enjoy movement and dance, as they move their bodies, arms and legs to 'draw' or 'make' number and letter shapes, in the air.


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
Simple instructions and questions to be answered orally or in written form are used in the books. Examples – Tell me why is Ticker 9 in trouble? What do you think has happened? Tell me what colour is the feather? What colours is Ticker 10? Find, match and join. Find, match the colours in shapes, letters, and words. Draw and cut around your hand. Write in the missing letters.


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
Children are encouraged to hear a word, break it down to discrete sounds, (segment) and then associate each sound with letters that make up the word. Teach the correct sounds orally, emphasising the unvoiced and unvoiced sounds. The use of magnetic letters and boards allow easy movement of letters, when segmenting the sounds.


The Ticker Books aim to introduce the early core skills in reading as children blend, sound, read, understand, and finally write complete words and sentences.



















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
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
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
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




















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
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
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
